Support for New York State Medical Aid in Dying Act

Currently, the New York Legislature is considering a bill, the New York State Medical Aid in Dying Act, that would allow a terminally ill patient - for whom two doctors have determined has under six months to live - the right to request and receive a prescription for medication to end their life. This would only be an option for patients who are acting voluntarily, capable of making their own healthcare decisions, and are able to self-administer the medication. 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This survey is based on 1,011 interviews conducted by YouGov on the internet of validated voters in New York. The sample was weighted according to gender, age, race/ethnicity, and education, based on voter registration lists, the U.S. Census American Community Survey and the U.S. Census Current Population Survey, as well as 2020 Presidential vote. The sample was also weighted according to religious self-identification based on Pew Research Center's Religious Landscape Study, and New York state region, based on the county voter registration information from the New York Board of Elections. Respondents were selected from YouGov to be representative of voters in New York. The weights range from 0.05 to 6.03 with a mean of 1 and a standard deviation of 0.77.

The margin of error (a 95% confidence interval) for a sample percentage p based upon the subsetted sample is approximately 3.9%. It is calculated using the formula:

$$\hat{p} \pm 100 imes \sqrt{rac{1 + \mathsf{CV}^2}{n}}$$

where *CV* is the coefficient of variation of the sample weights and *n* is the sample size used to compute the proportion. This is a measure of sampling error (the average of all estimates obtained using the same sample selection and weighting procedures repeatedly). The sample estimate should differ from its expected value by less than margin of error in 95 percent of all samples. It does not reflect non-sampling errors, including potential selection bias in panel participation or in response to a particular survey.
